


Increased in job vacancies following higher number of vacancies in **semi-skilled** and skilled jobs.


Majority are in **semi-skilled** category. By economic sector, **more than half** are in the Manufacturing sector.





SRU was more profound among youth graduates aged **24** years and below


Graduate Skill-related Underemployment rate (SRU)

92.5 per cent of graduates outside labour force did not seek for work due to **Housework/ Family responsibilities**; **Schooling/ Training**; and **Retired/ Old age**.

90 per cent of graduates outside the labour force due to **Housework/ Family responsibilities** were female.
